IMPORTANT COMMUNICATION NO.15/2018

It has come to the notice of the Board that in many cases, the filmmakers while specifying duration of the film do not make any provision for display of CBFC certificate which as per proviso to Rule 35(3) has to be for a minimum of 10 seconds. Consequently, the certificate in the exhibit is either not shown or shown for a fraction of a second. This is gross violation of Rule 35(3) of the Cinematograph (Certification) Rules, 1983.

The lab letter furnished with the application should include duration of certificate in the final lab certificate. For short films or trailers, the certificate duration should be a minimum of 3 seconds or for such duration as one can read it on the screen.

You are requested to please bring this issue to the consideration of your members and request them to comply with the same. If adequate space/duration is not allowed for the certificate and it is so discovered at the time of examination, the applicant will have to first rectify the problem before further processing happens. The ensuing delay in issue of certificate will be the sole responsibility of the applicant.
